About the Law School: The law school is located on its own 13-acre campus in Sacramento, the capital of California — the eighth largest economy in the world. Now in its 88th year, the school has over 12,000 living alumni, practicing in 50 states and in 58 foreign countries. It has a tradition of training excellent lawyers, including judges, legislators, and other government officials, to serve clients, the state, the nation, and the world. A Leader in Legal Education: The law school is a leader in legal education, long committed to emphasizing experiential learning and international perspectives throughout the curriculum. Its Trial Advocacy and International Law programs are regularly ranked among the top programs in the nation by *U.S. News & World Report*. On an overall basis, it has been consistently ranked among the top 100 law schools in the United States in recent years.

Students, Faculty, and Staff: During the current academic year, the law school has 960 J.D. students enrolled in its full-time and part-time divisions. The first-year class has a median LSAT score of 158 and a GPA of 3.40. It consists of students from 80 undergraduate institutions, located in 18 states and 2 foreign countries. Women constitute 46% of the class, while students of color comprise 33% of the class. In addition, the law school has 36 LL.M./J.S.D. students, coming from 20 foreign countries. The law school has 37 tenured or tenure-track professors and 12 full-time contract professors. The faculty is a highly collegial group, with a culture and community and mutual respect, and a commitment to student learning. Many of the 182 dedicated staff members have been employees of the school for decades.



About the University: Founded in 1851, the University of the Pacific was the first chartered institution of higher learning in California. Today Pacific offers more than 80 majors and academic programs to its 7,000 students, located on campuses in Stockton, San Francisco, and Sacramento. The main campus in Stockton was recently ranked as the fifth most attractive campus in the United States. Pacific has been lauded by *U.S. News & World Report* as a “Great School at a Great Price.”

About Sacramento: Sacramento is a vibrant community located in the heart of California's Central Valley, at the confluence of the Sacramento and American Rivers, with more than 300 days of sunshine each year. *Time* magazine has hailed it as “America's most diverse city,” while *Newsweek* has called it one of the “Ten Best Cities” in the United States. The law school is a 90-minute drive from the San Francisco Bay area and the Napa Valley.
